Assignments of Error

- 1. The Court of Appeals erred in affirming the trial court's finding that mental health evidence, offered under Virginia Code § 19.2-271.6, that has the tendency to negate multiple intent elements, is "speculative" and therefore inadmissible.
- 2. The Court of Appeals erred in affirming the trial court's exclusion of mental health evidence, offered under Va. Code § 19.2-271.6, on account of it not being sufficiently conclusory or exculpatory, was error in that it was an issue not of admissibility, but of weight, which was the province of the jury.
- 3. The Court of Appeals erred in affirming the trial court's exclusion of mental health evidence by applying a de novo standard of review which disregarded the trial court's findings of fact and flawed legal analysis.
